


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

A. Academic support and experiential learning-








Year-wise admission of students from reserved categories

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

Student participation in seminars using ICT facilities















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Exposure of students to Indo-Romanian Academic Exchange





Participation of students in Quiz competition organized in collaboration with Government General Degree College, Hili





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





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Participation of students in college magazines









B. Scholarship and Financial Aid-

Total number of students availing Government scholarships













C. Community Engagement and Social Responsibility

The institute fosters students to develop a sense of empathy and social awareness through initiatives that connect students with the community. To enable students to participate independently in the decision-making process, a series of lectures, conferences and workshops are conducted to make them aware of their power, rights and duties. 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

Awareness programme on human rights at adopted village 'Kathari' organized by NSS as a part of Special Camp







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





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E. Skill Development Programs and career counselling-


