Policy Document of the HEI for the Award of Scholarships and Free-ships

Taki Government College functions under the direct control and supervision of the Government of West Bengal in matters of recruitment, income and expenditure and other such crucial areas. Owing to the structural patterns of the administration, the policy for award of scholarships and free-ships of Taki Government College is virtually coextensive with the policy of the Government. Aligned with the vision to ensure education for aspiring and deserving students from diverse socio-economic strata, the institution ensures that no student faces educational deprivation due to financial barriers.

The course fee of the College being nominal, the students of the College currently avail various types of scholarships offered by the Government of West Bengal. There is variety in the amount received by them, which in turn are determined by several factors such as **merit** (percentage of marks scored in last qualifying examination), **gender** (coupled with educational attainment), **social categories** (SC, ST, OBC), **minority categories** (coupled with educational attainment), **day-scholar** or **hostel-dweller**, **course of study** (UG or PG) and **stream of study** (Science or Humanities) of concerned student. The following table shows the types of government scholarships that are currently availed by the students of the College.
